



### Former POW Inspirational at Chapter Luncheon

Our speaker for the luncheon held on October 19th was a prisoner of war for more than 5 years during the Vietnam War. The speaker was Jim Hickerson, retired Navy Captain. He related an event in his life which he could not express to anyone, without that person actually being there to experience the horror and fear which gripped him and all of his fellow prisoners. It was not a very comfortable situation to be in after being shot down in his attack plane over Vietnam.

Communication was difficult among fellow prisoners and tapping on the walls was the only way some could communicate with each other. Jim cited three things which particularly helped in his survival -- God, Country and Fellow Prisoners. His belief and faith in God was crucial to his survival during those horrifying years. He always believed that his Country, the USA, would never let them down, no matter what the circumstances were. His fellow prisoners supported each other by tapping code on adjoining walls of their prison which helped to bolster their belief in one another.



All in all, he feels that he was very fortunate to survive and considers himself lucky to be alive and that the support given by his Country makes him thankful everyday for his being alive and well. Everyone in the room was so intent on everything he said that you could hear a pin drop during his presentation. At the end, we all got up and gave him a standing ovation. It was quite a presentation and we are indeed fortunate in having patriots like Jim Hickerson willing to endure unimaginable hardships to defend our Country.

- The Secretary of Veteran Affairs, R. James Nicholson has selected Dr. James Hastings to serve as the next Director, VA Pacific Islands Health Care System (VAPIHCS).

Dr. Hastings will begin his tenure on October 30, 2005.

### Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) Program to Move from Hilo to Honolulu

The VA Pacific Island Health Care System will soon relocate their residential Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) Program from Hilo to Oahu. In a letter to our Chapter, the Acting Director, Brian J. O'Neill, M.D. stated that, "...this move will increase the mental health care for veterans throughout the Pacific Islands and will certainly enable us to better treat our newest veterans who served in Iraq and Afghanistan. Moving the PTSD from Hilo will in no way diminish mental health care programs for Hawaii veterans; nothing is lost."

### Medicare, TRICARE Payment Cuts Update

Senate Finance Committee Chairman Charles Grassley's (R-IA) proposed budget package includes reversal of significant cuts in 2006 Medicare and TRICARE payments to doctors. Under current law, those payments will be reduced 4.3%, starting in January. Grassley's plan would substitute a 1% payment increase.
