



## **Medicare and TRICARE Nursing Home Coverage**

Nursing home benefits are entitled to those with both Medicare and TRICARE coverage. With this dual coverage, Medicare is the primary payer and TRICARE provides the secondary coverage under TRICARE for Life (TFL).

### WHAT IS COVERED

For skilled nursing care to be covered under Medicare and TRICARE, the beneficiary must spend a minimum of 3 consecutive days, not including the day of discharge, at the hospital and must enter the nursing home within 30 days of being discharged from the hospital. Medical care is covered in a nursing home that has been certified to provide skilled nursing care. Such facilities have the staff and equipment to provide skilled nursing, skilled rehabilitation, or other medically necessary health care services, including prescription medications. Medical care is given in a skilled nursing facility under certain specific conditions. In order for benefits to be covered, the facility must be Medicare-certified and have a contract with TRICARE.

Skilled nursing care is defined as medically necessary services so complex that they can only be safely and effectively performed by, or under the supervision of, professional and/or technical personnel. The hospital stay must be determined as medically necessary, and the patient must be in need of skilled level care upon entering the nursing home facility. Skilled nursing care and rehabilitative therapies such as occupational therapy, physical therapy, and speech therapy are covered benefits. Room and board, prescribed drugs, and laboratory work are also covered. Medicare limits the number of days in the skilled nursing facility to 100 days per benefit period. Should skilled care be deemed as medically necessary beyond this coverage period, TRICARE will then cover the costs.

Skilled nursing homes will sometimes provide hospice care. The hospice must be certified by Medicare. If the medical doctor certifies that the beneficiary has less than six months to live, the beneficiary can be covered by Medicare and TRICARE.

### TRICARE (Cont.)

Respite care is a benefit for individuals who are living in a home with a family or other caregiver. Placing a loved one in a nursing home for a limited period of time gives respite to the caregiver. Respite services are available for up to 63 days in any financial year.

### WHAT IS NOT COVERED

Neither Medicare nor TRICARE will pay for custodial care. Custodial care is defined as assistance with activities of daily living. It is sometimes referred to as long-term care. If nursing home care is no longer covered under Medicare and TRICARE, the beneficiary is responsible for paying for the nursing home care. Because of this, it has been increasingly popular for individuals to buy long-term care insurance to cover nursing-home costs.


twenty showed up at the proper time and resulted in a great day on the course, thanks to my Army instructor and the beautiful weather.




