## Major General Vern T. Miyagi to Officiate at Installation Luncheon

The 2008 installation ceremony of the officers of our Aloha Chapter will be held during a buffet luncheon at Hale Ikena on Thursday, February 28<sup>th</sup>. This event will commence at 11:00 AM. We are honored to have Major General **Vern T. Miyagi** as our guest of honor to conduct the ceremony. He will present a brief update of the U.S. Pacific Command's current missions and activities. Incidentally, MG **Miyagi** is much more than our guest of honor—he is a member of our Aloha Chapter.

Major General **Vern T. Miyagi** assumed duties as the Mobilization Assistant to the Commander, United States Pacific Command (USPACOM) in February 2006.

MG **Miyagi** is a 1971 distinguished military graduate of the University of Hawaii ROTC program where he was commissioned and awarded a Bachelor of Business Administration degree. He later earned a Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Hawaii in 1972.

From 1972 to 1981, MG **Miyagi** served as an audit manager at Alexander Grant and Company where he earned his Certified Public Accounting certificate in 1974. In 1981, he became a full-time military technician with the Hawaii Army National Guard (HIARNG) as the Comptroller at the United States Property and Fiscal Office. His service includes: Commander, 2d Battalion, 299th Infantry; Plans, Operations, and Military Support Officer; Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Training (G3); Chief of Staff, and Commanding General of the HIARNG. During the Hurricane Iniki relief operations on Kauai in 1992, MG **Miyagi** served as the operations officer for the deployed HIARNG

Joint Task Force (JTF). In 2000, he served as HIARNG JTF commander for the Asian Development Bank civil disturbance contingency operation. More recently, MG **Miyagi's** primary focus was on the deployment of HIARNG soldiers in support of Operations Enduring Freedom (Afghanistan) and Iraqi Freedom. From 2003 to 2006, MG **Miyagi** also served in a dual-hat position as the Mobilization Assistant to the Director of Operations, USPACOM.

As the Mobilization Assistant to the Commander at USPACOM, MG **Miyagi** is the principal advisor to the Commander regarding reserve component readiness and operations and facilitates Homeland Security activities between the state, National Guard, active military, and Federal agencies.

MG **Miyagi's** military education includes: Armor Officer Basic Course; Quartermaster Advanced Course; U. S. Marine Corps Command and Staff College at Quantico, VA; Infantry Brigade and Battalion Command Course; and a U. S. Army War College Fellowship at the Ridgway Center for International Security Studies at the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to serving in the HIARNG, MG **Miyagi** served in the U. S. Army Reserve (USAR) in the 100th Battalion, 442d Infantry.

His decorations and awards include: Legion of Merit; Meritorious Service

## Changes to TRICARE For Life

TRICARE For Life (TFL) beneficiaries now can print a copy of their Explanation of Benefits (EOB) from home. Also beginning in January 2008, monthly summaries are the only paper EOB's that beneficiaries will receive with the following exceptions:

- a claim that includes services that are rejected and those services have appeal rights; or
- the EOB is mailed with a payment to the beneficiary.

Starting in February, beneficiaries have the option to receive an electronic notification every time a claim processes. Beneficiaries then can log on to the secure Web site at [www.TRICARE4U.com](http://www.TRICARE4U.com), to view and print their EOB. The EOB will be available online for any claim processed during the last 27 months. Once a beneficiary signs up for this option, they will not receive a monthly paper summary. TFL beneficiaries will receive letters notifying them of the changes, either with their current EOB's or any other correspondence.

## Changes to SBP Premium Payments

Participants in the Uniformed Services Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) for retired military members have a milestone to mark on their calendars. Effective 1 October 2008, SBP participants who reach 70 years of age, and have made 360 payments (30 years), will no longer have to pay premiums for continued SBP coverage and will be placed on the "Paid-up SBP status."

A paid-up status, beginning on 1 October 2008, will be established for participants in the Retired Serviceman's Family Protection Plan (RSFPP) once they reach 70 years of age.

No action is required of SBP participants to be placed in Paid-up SBP status. Once the eligibility has been met, the Defense Finance and Accounting Services (DFAS) will automatically stop deducting premiums from qualifying military retired pay accounts.

The law does not allow for refunds of premiums paid before 1 October 2008, even though a

retiree may have reached 70 years of age and made 360 or more premium payments before that date.

DFAS is developing changes to the military retiree pay systems to monitor the number of SBP premiums paid and the age of the participants who will be eligible for Paid-up SBP status on 1 October 2008, or will meet eligibility within a short time of the implementation date. They will be notified by mail of their impending Paid-up status.

Those military retirees who become eligible for Paid-up SBP status after the initial group will be notified of their SBP status on their December 2008 annual Retiree Account Statements (RAS) which will note the number of premiums paid to date.

Keep members informed, generally by means of the chapter newsletter on facilities and services available in the area, *i.e.*, exchanges, commissary, and hospital.

### Spouse ID Card

Check your spouse's ID card to ensure that it is still valid. Normally, it will expire every four years. TRICARE services will be denied without a valid ID card. Permanent cards are issued after age 75.
