HAWAII VETERANS GOODWILL DELEGATION 4 Goodwill Visit to China in Fall 2010


On 20 November 2010 the fourth Hawaii Veterans Goodwill Delegation (HVGD) left for China on a goodwill mission at the invitation of the China Association for International Friendly Contact (CAIFC) and organized by the Chinese Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii (CCCH). The delegation was represented by ADM (retired) **Thomas Fargo**, former Commander of Pacific Command; MG (retired) **Eric Olson**, former Commander of the 25th Infantry Division; BG (retired) **Frances Mossman**, U.S. Air Force and one of first female generals in the U.S. armed forces; BG (retired) **John Ma**, former Deputy Commander, U.S. Army Pacific; and group leader COL (retired) **Wesley Fong**, U.S. Army, who is also a past president of the CCCH. Delegate wives also accompanied the group.

First stop was a visit to the China Peace-Keeping Police Training Center, which trains their cadre for United Nations peace keeping missions around the world. In the afternoon the delegates participated in a three hour symposium with representatives from the China National Defense University discussing international issues dealing with Asia-Pacific security and Sino-U.S. relations, which exchange proved to be both candid and dynamic.

The next day the delegation visited the 6th Armored Division of the People's Liberation Army (PLA) and was greeted with a band and a "pass in review" by the unit's honor guard. After touring the facility the delegation shared a typical Chinese army meal with the troops. In the afternoon it was a visit to the PLA Military Museum with two sections housing not only ancient and modern military weapons but Chinese MIG's, tanks and artillery. The day ended with a formal meeting

with the Director of the General Political Department of the PLA and member of the Central Military Committee, GEN **Li Ji Nai**, and the top officials of the CAIFC at Ba Yi Building (China's "Pentagon'). The delegation, for the first time, was hosted at a very elegant banquet at Ba Yi complete with 16 year old Mou Tai for toasting.

Leaving Beijing, the delegation headed for Mianyang, the scene of the 2008 earthquake, where they visited the town that lost over 10,000 to the earthquake and now stands as a memorial to those who perished in the earthquake. After a somber visit and paying their respects to those lost at the town's memorial site, the group was most heartened with a visit to Yong Sheng Elementary School in Jiang You Town to see the school's library recently built with donations from the Hawaii Chinese community organized by the CCCH right after the earthquake and meet with the school's principal and town and county leaders and enjoy the company of the many excited students.

The next few days were filled with sightseeing—in Leshan to visit the biggest Buddha in the world and Chengdu to visit the Panda Breeding and Research Center. Unfortunately the pandas were not in the mood to be held that day. The last stop was Shanghai and a visit to an 800-year-old water town about two hours drive outside of Shanghai. The tour ended with another elegant banquet hosted by the Shanghai CAIFC in the State Guest House.

The delegation returned to Hawaii on 29 November. Everyone agreed that this HVGD's visit came at a very fortuitous time with the tension between the two militaries is on a high and dialogue on a low. Being able to talk on an informal "one to one" basis with Chinese military counterparts on a candid but cordial and sincere basis indeed helped improve a more friendly relationship and understanding between the two militaries. We sincerely thank the CAIFC and the CCCH for initiating and organizing another successful Hawaii Veterans Goodwill Delegation.

Holiday Festival of Lights Pearl Harbor Boat Tours

Free Holiday Festival of Lights Pearl Harbor evening boat tours will again be offered to the public this year on December 17, 18 and 19. Offered as a community service by the National Park Service in cooperation with the US Navy and with volunteer support from the Pearl City Lions Club, the boat tours will depart from the Pearl Harbor Visitor Center (formerly known as the USS *Arizona* Memorial Visitor Center) each evening from 6:10 to 8:30 PM. The boat tours depart the landing approximately every 10 minutes. Seats are limited and tickets will be distributed on a first come, first served basis beginning at 5:30 PM at the Visitor Center on the day of the tour.

The 30-minute tours will feature harbor-side views of the many Pearl Harbor ships and submarines decked out with holiday decorations and lights accompanied by background Christmas music. This will be an exciting and memorable experience for youngsters and oldsters, too.

As stated, the boat tours are FREE, but tour participants are invited to bring a donation of non-perishable or canned foods for Hawaii's food charities.
