JPAC Tour

Your Program Committee has a very interesting and educational event planned for our next meeting.

At 9:30 AM. Thursday, March 17th, we will meet at the Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command (JPAC) at Hickam AFB to tour their Central Identification Laboratory (CIL), the largest forensics laboratory in the world.



The tour will start at 10 AM with an overview of the overall mission of JPAC.

Then, we will learn the various methods they employ to determine the definite identity of the remains that have been retrieved from America's conflicts all over the world, sometimes from long ago. These remains are always treated with the utmost respect from the time they found until they are finally returned to the family members for their belated burial in a marked grave. Finally, we will be shown the various retrieval methods, ensuring that even the smallest bone fragments and items are found, often in difficult and dangerous environments.



The highest priority, course, is the return of any living Americans that remain prisoners of war.

Commanded by a joint serflag officer, vices MG Stephen D. Tom, USA,



JPAC ismanned approximately 400 handpicked Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, Ma-

rines and Department of the Navy civilians. JPAC also maintains three permanent overseas detachments to assist with command and control. logistics and in-country support during investigation and recovery operations. They are located in Bangkok, Thailand; Hanoi, Vietnam; and Vientiane, Laos. JPAC has a fourth detachment located at Pearl Harbor that is responsible for recovery team personnel when they are not deployed.

After our tour, we will proceed as a group to the nearby Sea Breeze Restaurant, 3465 Harbor Street, Hickam AFB, for a buffet luncheon. selections will include Fresh Garden Salad with Polly Seed Dressing, Steamed White Rice, Kalua Pork and Onions. 


