## Identifying and Recruiting "War Veteran" Members

The article on page 4 of the April 2012 issue of Na Leo O Na Koa explained the need for recruiting more "war veteran" members for Aloha Chapter to receive contributions which would be deductible on an individual's tax return. This article explains why Aloha Chapter now needs to identify current members who are "war veterans" and to *recruit* new "war veterans" from among officers now serving on active duty who are clearly "war veterans" [see Persian Gulf War below] or former and retired officers.

#### A. IDENTIFYING "WAR VETERANS:"

- EACH <u>current regular and life member</u> of Aloha Chapter who served or is still serving in the Armed Forces during a period of war, as defined below, should check the appropriate box, write your name, and return a copy of this page by mail to Board Chairman Mark Webster at P.O. Box 201441, Honolulu, HI 96820 or e-mail this information to <u>markster96816@gmail.com</u> or merely phone him at 808-734-5994 and leave a message stating your periods of qualifying active duty service.
- EACH <u>auxiliary member</u> of Aloha Chapter who also formerly served in the Armed Forces during a period of war, as defined below, should also check the appropriate box and return a copy by mail or e-mail to Mark. Changing status from Auxiliary to Regular is NOT necessary for self-identification as a "war veteran."

Periods of War specified in 38 U.S.C. sec. 101 for definition of persons as "war veterans" include the following [omitting the Indian Wars, Spanish-American War and World War II: Please check the box for the earliest period of war in which you served.

- ☐ World War II: December 7, 1941, through December 31, 1946, inclusive. If the veteran was in service on December 31, 1946, continuous service before July 26, 1947 is considered World War II service.
- ☐ Korean Conflict: June 27, 1950, through January 31, 1955, inclusive.
- ☐ Vietnam Era: (a) The period beginning on February 28, 1961, and ending on May 7, 1975, inclusive, in the case of a veteran who served in the Republic of Vietnam during that period; OR



- (b) The period beginning on August 5, 1964, and ending on May 7, 1975, inclusive, in all other cases.
- ☐ Persian Gulf War: August 2, 1990, and ending on the date prescribed by Presidential Proclamation or by law. According to IRS guidelines, the end date is open.

<u>Peacetime Periods</u> of service are, therefore, these intervals *between* the periods of war specified above from:

December 31, 1946 (or July 26, 1947), through June 27, 1950;

January 31, 1955, through August 5, 1964 (assuming **no** earlier service in RVN); and

May 7, 1975, through August 2, 1990.

**Peacetime Only Veterans** would apply to those Aloha Chapter members whose service in the Armed Forces was **entirely** within the peacetime periods noted above. If this is true for you, please check only this box:  $\square$ .



## **Preview of September Program**

We will meet at 10:30 AM, Saturday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>, for a guided tour of the Pacific Aviation Museum followed by a special luncheon.

Opened on the 65th anniversary of the bombing of Pearl Harbor, the first phase of this historical museum (in a 42,442-sq.-ft. hangar) on Ford Island tells the story of military aviation in the Pacific during World War II via a collection of original, historical aircraft (Japanese Zero fighter, Navy Wildcat fighter, Army Air corps B-25 Michell bomber, and so on), documentary films, displays (the story of the little-known battle of Niihau, where the Hawaiian residents captured a crash-landed Japanese pilot), and (our favorite) the interactive simulated aircraft control where you can "experience" what it was like to fly either an American or Japanese plane. They recently have added an "Aviator's Guided Tour," where trained tour guides take you on a journey into aviation history, with stories about the planes and the battles they saw, plus you get a sneak peak into behind the scenes at the museum with access to parts of the collection not generally seen by the public (like aircraft being restored, a close-up of the F-14 Tomcat, the F-15 Eagle, Bell helicopters, and other vintage aircraft).
