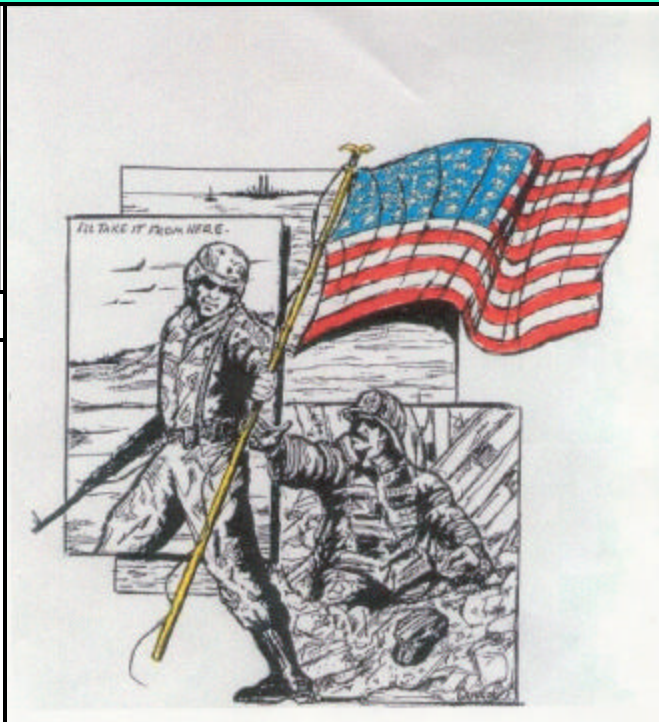

Hawaii's Veterans Administration Scores a Slam Dunk in Ambulatory Care
Office of Veterans Services has a new Director

Dave Burge congratulated everyone connected with the recently completed Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO) survey. The VA Ambulatory Care Center and neighbor island clinics received a preliminary score of 100%. The JCAHO team indicated that this was only the 5th perfect score for ambulatory health care in 8 years and is remarkable in that the standards have been made significantly more rigorous with private and public facilities across the

nation currently scoring in the 85-89% range. In other components of the survey this year, mental health, long term care and home care received scores of 99% each. The JCAHO surveyors commended VA leadership for their success in managing such a broad array of programs with service delivery sites scattered on islands outside of Oahu. Veterans Day 2001

January 2002 Cost of Living Adjustment

The Bureau of Labor Statistics announced that for MOST people the annual cost-of-living adjustment for various federal programs, including Social Security and military retired pay, will be 2.6% and applied in January 2002.

Concurrent Receipt

At this writing the FY2002 Defense Authorization Bill remains stalled in Congress. The Senate and House versions are different. A conference committee will meet shortly to resolve the differences. Current Receipt authorization is in these bills but only the Senate version contains the authority to pay. Ef-

forts continue to encourage the conferees to accept the Senate version.

Bud Day Files Appellate Brief

Col. Bud Day advises that he has filed a supplementary brief with the eleven (11) member Federal Circuit Court of Appeals in Washington, D. C. on September 7, 2001. The U.S. Attorney General will be allowed until November 21, 2001 to answer the Appellate brief. Following that, the Court will allow Col. Day to reply to the Attorney General's answer.

Oral arguments will be scheduled, on the briefs, by the 11 member Court sometime in 2002. Col. Day states that the issues and facts have been narrowed considerably by the Court, and that he believes that the Class Act case and facts are much clearer and much stronger than before.

HOMELAND SECURITY AND THE JOINT REAR AREA COORDINATOR-HAWAII (JRAC-HI)

After the- September 11th terrorists attacks in New York City and Washington, D.C., it became apparent to the U.S. Department of Defense (DOD) that the armed forces needed to protect installations and critical infrastructure to ensure the military's ability to perform its mission. 'Protecting military assets in America is not a new concept, however there is a focused shift from traditional "front lines", which were normally outside U.S. borders. In military terms, now our nation is considered the "rear area." Protecting the United States in this context is a relatively new concept but one that can no longer be ignored.

Soon after the World Trade Center and Pentagon incidents, the Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Command appointed the Commander, U.S. Army, Pacific as the Joint Rear Area Coordinator for Hawaii, or "JRAC-HI." In this position, the new JRAC-HI is responsible for ensuring the close coordination of Homeland Defense efforts with all the armed forces in Hawaii as well as with local, state and federal civilian agencies in defense of critical military resources and in its support to civil authorities.

The JRAC-Hi concept involves organizing all mili-

tary facilities and infrastructure in Hawaii into "Base Clusters" to facilitate planning, prioritization of efforts, and coordination with civilian agencies. Each Base Cluster has a designated Base Cluster Commander. The Air Force Base Cluster is headquartered at Hickam Air Force Base, the Army at Schofield Barracks, the Navy at Pearl Harbor, the Marines at Kaneohe Bay Marine Corps Base, and the Coast Guard at Honolulu Harbor. A joint-interagency intelligence support element has also been established to provide daily intelligence support to the JRAC-HI, Base Cluster Commanders, and to local, state and federal agencies.

The JRAC-HI has no civil law enforcement authority. If an incident or attack takes place in the civilian community, the appropriate state and local emergency service agencies will be the first responders and will retain primary responsibility to protect the residents of Hawaii. The military will continue to stand ready, however, to provide emergency assistance as it always has through the Military Support to Civilian Authorities (MSCA) program.

TRICARE for LIFE is now in place as of 1 October 2001. If any Medicare B eligible member is having any difficulty having their physician or hospital (except Kaiser) accept this Medicare supplemental medical insurance program please contact me at **261-2282 or email at JandBHarms@cs.com** . Either myself or Philipia Davidson of Health Net will contact the party/agency involved and get the situation squared away.

To show qualification for TRICARE for LIFE a member and/or his family will show their Medicare ID card (with Medicare B identified being in force) and their US Military retired/spouse ID card. These will normally be Xeroxed for the patients medical/insurance records. On the reverse side of the US Military retired/spouse ID card is a civilian medical service expiration date. This is null and void, and should NOT be used by the medical person/facility as qualifying for TRICARE for LIFE supplemental insurance. When a member/spouse is issued a new ID card there will be no expiration date. The military is not wholesale issuing new ID cards as the result of implementation of TRICARE for LIFE, especially now with the focus on the war on terrorism. Again a problem contact me at 261-2282 or JandBHarms@cs.com.

Most hospitals/doctors do not have TRICARE for LIFE listed as a Medicare B medical supplement in their accounting computer systems yet. I found this out yesterday when I had a medical appointment with Straub. This will take time to get this word out. If a medical agency has a question about this call/contact me or **Health Net (Philipia Davidson) at 532-2218 or (Lynn Cuthrell) at 532-2215.**

Tripler "Champus Plus or Silver" programs have been redesigned as "Tripler Tricare Plus (TTP) program effective 1 October 2001. If anyone has questions about this program they can contact **Tripler Managed Care office at 433-3494 of Ms. Terri Cloud at 433-7986.**

Letters offering a briefing on TRICARE for LIFE by TROA-Hawaii chapter was provided to six senior citizen retirement facilities during the last AARP "Senior Citizen Fair" at Blasdale Arena. No requests have been received to date for this briefing. I will send out follow on mailings to the directors of these facilities this week, hoping for some type of response. Only additional item; TRICARE for LIFE has now

been in effect 21 days and I have only had two telephone calls for any assistance. One was from the Big Island just asking to clarify some of his perceptions of the program, and a second asking about the claims processing, i.e., Medicare B will pay first on claim then Medicare will send claim to TRICARE for LIFE for secondary payment. Doctor/hospital only has to make one claim.

Our membership should have received the superb brochure from TROA National Headquarters focusing on explaining TRICARE for LIFE to medical service providers. These should be used as a pamphlet to be given to those persons/ organizations as required. If additional copies are needed please contact me at telephone **261-2282 or email "JandBHarms@cs.com"**.

TRIPLER TOPICS

The TRICARE Hawaii Regional Beneficiary Advisory Council/Health Consumer Committee met on 25 July 2001. Maj. Paul Sander (433-7073) is the TAMC project officer for TRICARE For Life (TFL). His staff presents a briefing on TFL every Tuesday from 1100 to 1200 in room 212, G wing, 4th floor, across from the refill pharmacy. There have been some glitches with TFL claims because some records didn't get transferred properly. In those cases, Medicare did not automatically send billing information on to TRICARE. Patients affected had to process a claim direct to TFL for claims to be paid. Glitches affected only 13% of claims and few if any here. Any questions or problems contact TFL at 1-800-242-6788.

TRICARE Plus applications are still being processed for Tripler Silver members. Staff could review the program for additional openings as early as January 2002. Flu shots should be available at Tripler by 2 December. The flu shots are available at a number of civilian clinics and other locations on Oahu. Optometry services are now being provided at Schofield Barracks, as the Tripler office is closed to install Lasik equipment.

A new consolidated off-site pharmacy refill pick-up site is now open in the Navy Housing area at 3189 Nimitz Road, Building 4. To reach the site, turn mauka from Nimitz Highway onto Camp Caitlin, then make an immediate right onto Nimitz Road. When you call the pharmacy refill number, 433-6962, follow the prompts to have your refills available for pick-up the next day. The site is wheelchair accessible with adequate parking and without passing through a security checkpoint. It will be open weekdays from 1000 to 1800. You will not be able to pick-up certain controlled medications at this site. The pick-up site will be moved to the new Naval Exchange when it is completed.

Dengue Fever is a viral disease transmitted to humans by the bite of an infected mosquito. The symptoms show up within two weeks of exposure and can cause a sudden onset of high fever, severe headache, muscle and bone pains as well as many other symptoms. There is no antibiotic treatment for the virus, only supportive therapies such as rehydration for the symptoms and possible complications of the infection. Civilian Public Health agencies are providing briefings at neighborhood board meetings around Oahu. More information on Dengue Fever can be obtained through the TAMC Medical Entomologist at 433-6693.

There have been no Anthrax cases in Hawaii. Suspected cases have all been disproved upon additional diagnosis. The latest recommended action if you have a suspect item, is to cover it with a damp towel and leave it alone. Evacuate the area and call 911. Wash your hands with soap and water plus any part of your body that may have come in contact with the item. Tripler will not issue antibiotics for Anthrax without a confirmed diagnosis of exposure. Availability of parking spaces near the hospital has improved so that patients can find parking in the flag pole area 90% of the time and in the garage, 100% of the time. The parking area by the mountain entrance is controlled for use by those with permanent or temporary disabilities. Parking congestion is worst on Mondays and least on Thursdays and Fridays. The clinics will try to spread out patient appointments more evenly through out the week. We as patients can assist by accepting appointments for later in the week.

The Provost Marshall will issue special Identification documents for family members without military ID cards to be able to visit hospitalized patients. A new program concerning patient safety is being worked on. Patient comment cards will soon have questions to supply input. TAMC Holiday schedule is from 17 December through 1 January. Clinics will be open on their regular schedule. Tripler will be surveyed by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations in December. The next meeting will be on 23 January 2002.
